A quorum was present and Chair, Rolando Cabrera, MD, called the meeting to order at 8:34 a.m.

APPROVE MINUTES OF THE COMMUNITY ADVOCACY COMMITTEE MEETING OF NOVEMBER 15, 2022

CONSIDER RECOMMENDATION FOR BOARD APPROVAL OF 2022 COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT AND SALINAS VALLEY MEMORIAL HEALTHCARE SYSTEM IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

Salinas Valley Memorial Healthcare System in collaboration with the other three hospitals in Monterey County, the United Way, the Monterey County Health Department, and the Hospital Council of Northern California, formed the Monterey County Health Needs Collaborative. The initial purpose of this collaborative group was to complete a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA), which is the culmination of months of research into the pressing health needs of our community. In addition to the CHNA, Salinas Valley Memorial Healthcare System has created an Implementation Strategy - our plan to

address community health issues described in the CHNA. Both of these documents are attached.

In order to comply with IRS regulations and maintain our non-profit status, every three years Salinas Valley Memorial Healthcare System is required to document our community benefit activities in a Community Health Needs Assessment and an accompanying Implementation Strategy. While this activity fulfills the requirements of the federal government, we find its true value to be far greater. The information contained in the CHNA is vital in meeting the mission of our organization to provide quality healthcare to our patients, and to improve the health and wellbeing of our community.

The Salinas Valley Health Medical Center Fiscal Years 2023-2025 Implementation Strategy was presented which included review of the Salinas Valley Health Community Health Initiatives, the service area, the purpose of an implementation strategy, health needs identified and Implementation Strategy Development. Salinas Valley Health Medical Center has identified and plans to address the following three health needs: (1) Behavioral Health, (2) Healthcare Access and Delivery and (3) Healthy Lifestyles. Long-term goals, strategies and anticipated impact were reviewed for each. Salinas Valley Health will monitor and evaluate strategies for the purpose of tracking implementation and documenting anticipated impact.

Full reports were included in the packet.

Discussion: Mr. Hernandez Laguna asked if there were any learnings from the partnership? Karina Rusk, Director of Public Relations, reported the entities continue to collaborate. The data is very rich and meaningful. The door is open for other partnerships. Dr. Cabrera requested additional information on patients served by the Mobile Clinic. Ms. Carson requested the Community Health Needs Assessment and the Salinas Valley Health Implementation Strategy be printed and provided for all Board members.

BLUE ZONES PROJECT

Adrienne Laurent, Chief Communication Officer, and Tiffany DiTullio, CAO, Community Wellness, reported the Blue Zones Project in collaboration with Aspire Health has received a California Department of Food and Agriculture Grant for \$1M. The grant focuses on increasing access to fresh foods and vegetables. \$600K will go towards food incentives. BZP and Aspire Health are focusing on optimizing point of sale systems for electronic benefits on California-grown produce which yields a 50% discount off produce. A request for support with advocacy on AB-605 which would create ongoing funding to help with nutrition incentives. Using data from the CHNA will help target areas for greatest impact. The biggest hurdle will be to educate the public and there are plans to collaborate with the Mobile Clinic. Administration will coordinate a meeting with Assemblyman Robert Rivas. It was suggested Senator Anna Caballero would also be an important ally.

REPORT FROM THE SALINAS VALLEY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL SERVICE LEAGUE

Adrienne Laurent reported volunteer services have been opened in the Surgery Lobby and the Outpatient Infusion Center. \$1,000 has been raised through the leather sale and wreath sale. The Service League

REPORT FROM THE SALINAS VALLEY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL FOUNDATION

Jeff Wardwell, Chief Philanthropy Officer, presented a report of the Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation including a brief history of the Foundation, its 501c3 status, and its association to the Healthcare System. In reporting on the Foundation administered programs, it was presented that 258 Individual Grants totaling \$46,572.25 have been granted through the Patient Assistance Program for year-to-date FY23; referral sources are CRC, the Mobile Clinic, SVMH, SVMC and Palliative care. The Children's Miracle Network funded Pediatric Medical Needs Program supported 16 individual grants totaling \$12,955.05 FY23 YTD. The Foundation is *Meeting Needs Where They Are* through generous support by Monterey Peninsula Foundation and Rite-Aid Healthy Futures grants. The Foundation is *Supporting Workforce Development* through the Medical Education Scholarship Endowment (founded by ER physicians), the Kim Kelly Memorial Nursing Scholarship and the Haynes Charitable Health Education Scholarship. Additionally the Foundation is leveraging existing resources to support our Magnet program, pursuing a grant with the Department of Labor to supplement regional healthcare workforce initiatives and assisting physician recruitment and retention. The Foundation is *Helping Our Community Rise* through its participation in the Regions Rise Together Salinas initiative, and its partnership with the James Irvine Foundation, and the Monterey Bay Economic Partnership.


