



4. PATIENT CARE SERVICES UPDATE: REHAB SERVICES PRACTICE COUNCIL

Clement Miller, COO, introduced Jan Conducto, M.S., OTR/L (Co-Chair), who reported the following:

- Council Purpose
- Goals
 - o Foster a culture of professional development.
 - o Improve quality and efficiency of patient care.
 - Establish a mechanism through which the practicing professional is able to fully participate in the decisions which affect rehabilitation related practice, quality, competence and knowledge.
- Current Initiatives
 - o Cardiac Rehab Phase I: Updated cardiac protocol to follow best practice guidelines (Keep Your Move In The TubeTM): including discussion of benefits, interdisciplinary collaboration, education and training, EMR order set revision, and go live in October.
 - Early Mobilization of Patients on Mechanical Ventilation: including discussion of benefits and ABCDEF Bundle, interdisciplinary collaboration, education and training. The initiative was developed by a collaborative interdisciplinary team.
- Future Initiatives
 - o Mobilization of Patients on CRRT (Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy)

A full report was provided in the packet.

Committee Discussion: Dr. Cabrera: Early mobilization also helps to prevent DVTs. Director Carson: Have we had any patients for early mobilization yet? After the policy goes live, the initiative will start. We only have a few patients on ventilators, the mobilization will be selective. There is a dedicated Cardiac Rehab for after-discharge care.

Council Purpose

- Provide clinical leadership by identifying and implementing standards of care and evidenced based practice to night shift staff.
- Collaborate with multi-disciplinary departments to improve night shift processes for positive outcomes and increase engagement of employees who work off shift hours.

Completed Initiatives:

Salinas Valley

1. Quiet Menu and Quiet Menu Kit

- Background: Based on an EBP¹ initiative performed by the UCSF², utilization of a "Sleep Menu" would result in patients sleeping more soundly at night (Antonio, 2020), and more inclined to respond positively on HCAHPS³ survey questions related to hospital environment being conducive to rest and recovery.
- The Intervention: The NSPC⁴ adapted the initiative and created the "Quiet Menu."
- The NSPC partnered with the marketing department to create the handout/flyer.
- The Patient Experience team assembled the "Quiet Menu Kit" containing items purchased by the Salinas Valley Health Foundation.
- The NSPC continues to find creative ways to promote the use of the "Quiet Menu" via WINTip Sheet, staff
 educational fairs, staff competency camps, and similar training opportunities.
- A poster abstract is in development to submit to Salinas Valley Health Poster Expo 2025.


Completed Initiatives Cont.



2. Quiet at Night Recommitment Initiative

- Goal: To improve the HCAHPS Quiet at Night Top-Box Score from baseline [CY231] of 47.1% to 51.8% [+10%].
- **Background:** Patient Experience Leader Rounding highlighted environmental noise factors that create impactful disruptions in sleep: hospital equipment, alarms, paging systems, delivery carts, and conversations of care team members and visitors.
- The Intervention: In 2022, NSPC members created seven "Commitment Statements" that engages staff to be personally accountable for the removal of preventative noise within inpatient units.
 - Posters were created with these statements, signed by staff, laminated/framed and mounted in each unit.
 - Sound decibel meters were placed within close proximity of these frames in order to provide real-time feedback of noise levels.
 - Unit-specific targets are displayed next to each meter on a mounted, laminated card targets were adjusted based on data
 collected from the meters to allow for structural and ambient noise within each unit.
 - Throughout 2024, NSPC members rounded on units to "recommit" staff to the 2022 commitment statements.

Outcome: Quiet at Night Recommitment Initiative





Current Initiatives:

1. Structural Noise Issues



Background: In 2023, rounding on inpatient units were conducted by NSPC members along with Dr. Bruce Kaufman, Delirium Prevention Taskforce champion, to identify structural noise issue(s) and submit Engineering Work Order (EWO) if necessary for solution. Noise concerns discussed: pneumatic tube system, slamming of doors, service elevator voice announcement system, WOWs¹ and similar rolling cart/device.

Progress:

- Pneumatic tube system foam noise canceling kit has been installed in all inpatient units.
- Adjusted door closer setting in several areas to slow down the closing speed of a door.
- Use of equipment to slow down the speed of a closing door has been implemented in several areas. Replacement or repair of WOWs by IT service technicians continues to be prevalent. A complete change of style and mechanism to the door leading from the hospital main lobby to the Heart Center has been recently completed.

What's Ahead:

- Continue to track related patient experience scores.
- Track progress of strategies implemented to reduce structural and environmental noise with Engineering support.

2. Trial a "Quiet at Night" Announcement



- **Background:** To reinforce our seven "Commitment Statements" initiative and encourage staff and visitors to promote a restful and healing environment, we launched a trial, "Quiet at Night" hospital-wide PA¹ system announcement.
 - The pre-recorded announcement will broadcasted daily at 11 PM in both English and Spanish with the following message: "We are committed to providing a restful and healing environment. At this time, we ask for your cooperation in contributing to a quiet atmosphere by speaking softly, minimizing the use of electronics, or turning devices off."
- What's Ahead: Starting January 2025, two new questions regarding Restfulness of Hospital Environment will be added to the HCAHPS survey:
 - 1. During this hospital stay, how often were you able to get the rest you needed?
 - 2. During this hospital stay, did doctors, nurses and other hospital staff help you to rest and recover?
 - The NSPC is attempting to ingrain the hospital staff's efforts to allow patients to rest and recover.
 - A staff survey will be sent to capture feedback on the effectiveness of the "Quiet at Night" announcement.

What's Ahead:



- The NSPC is seeking an ancillary employee to become a permanent active NSPC member.
- Collaborate with intra-professional staff in various departments [i.e. Pharmacy and Environmental Services], to enhance the "Quiet at Night" campaign.
- Expand the use of lavender as a calming agent for patients experiencing anxiety and insomnia.
